9:45AM – 10:15AM	Teams (Connect + Strategize)		<p>Some parents in the Maryvale community have voiced they do not want their children walking to the Desert West Skate Park due to the high number of pedestrian/vehicle accidents in the area.</p> <p>The nearby school district offices have since become a place where community youth are skateboarding, but this too, is a high traffic location, adjacent to a busy Walmart parking lot. The perception of many adults in the community is that skateboarding is not a productive activity for youth.</p>	<p>During a community meeting, several Maryvale residents reminisced over fond memories of meeting up at the “park strip” near 55<sup>th</sup> Ave. and Indian School, then walking to school together.</p> <p>They described how walking to school together in groups made them feel safe, gave them a sense of community and the opportunity to make new friends.</p> <p>The residents voiced that they would like to see this experience in the area again.</p>	<p>The Cartwright School District in Maryvale has a large space that houses a community garden, some of which is partially used.</p> <p>The garden has been the target of vandalism in the past, most notably the mobile garden bus was set on fire.</p> <p>The school district has a goal of providing community garden plots to families in the area to farm.</p>
